The thematic process in qualitative research involves identifying, analyzing, and interpreting patterns or themes within data. Here's a breakdown of the thematic process:

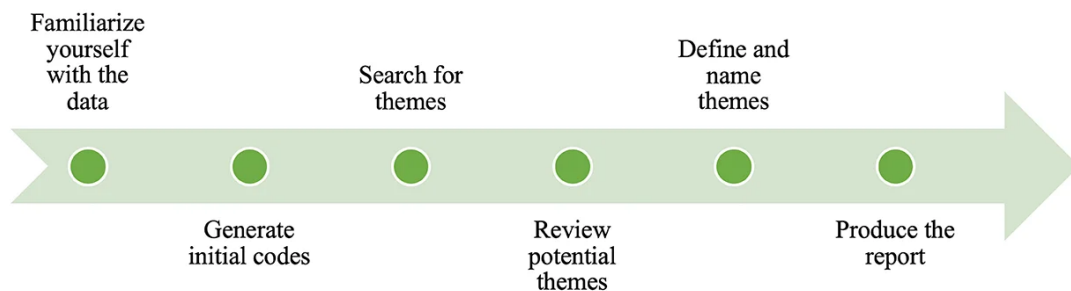


FIGURE 1: THEMATIC STEP
